Committee Reports

Mayor – Lydia M. Dodd

Thank you for joining us this evening for our Regular Business Meeting.

Vacant Property Registration Report. For the month of July the Township received \$3,750.00. Total amount received in 2021 is \$61,750.00.

Zoning Department. 36 applications approved, 13 applications pending review, 2 denial applications in Zoning.

Code Enforcement. 29 Notices of Violation, 12 second Notices of Violation, 4 properties abated their violations. 1 Property Lien.

Ordinance 2021-15. This ordinance tonight is on for first reading. This bond ordinance is a General Bond Ordinance and lists items necessary to allow the first responders to be able to do their job efficiently. Each Department Police, Fire and First Aid need new radios. The radios that are being used will be phased out by the end of this year. This bond includes radios and other general Police Department equipment including an antenna. The antenna is necessary in the West part of the Township. It also has listed the NJ Department of Transportation (NJDOT) Grant including drainage. The Township needs to pay the cost of the work up front and when it is completed it will be submitted for reimbursement.

Veteran's Park is also listed in the ordinance. This park is budgeted for and will be paid for out of the Open Space Fund. At this time, the property is not listed in the Recreation Open Space Inventory (ROSI). This is a requirement. The Township is working on having the inventory updated. This allows the Township to remain with the opening of the park on Veteran's Day, November 11, 2021. This process of updating the ROSI is starting tonight with Resolution 2021-219. The public hearing for the ordinance will be September 21st at 6 pm.

Adopt a Bench Program. Please be reminded a resident or organization can purchase a bench for any of the parks in the Township including Veteran's Park. There have been inquiries and some of the first benches ordered will be installed at Waretown Bayfront Park and Pier by the end of next week. The forms are in Town Hall. A total of nine (9) benches have been ordered from this program.

Ordinance 2021-16. This ordinance being introduced tonight for first reading is regarding vacant property. There has been a change in the law, and this will bring the vacant property registration into compliance at this time. The public hearing will be September 21^{st} at 6:00 pm.

Ordinance 2021-17. This ordinance being introduced tonight is regarding fences. Residents have brought to the Township Committee's attention items in the fence ordinance that needs change. The Township has taken into consideration, sections of the Township that cannot comply with the ordinance on the books and are making the adjustments with this ordinance. The public hearing will be September 21st at 6:00 pm.

Resolutions 2021-212 thru 2021-216. These resolutions are canceling taxes for Veteran's as per State law. These resolutions can only be completed after the tax rate is set. We thank our Veteran's for their service.

Deputy Mayor – Ben LoParo

Good evening.

Ordinance 2021-14. This ordinance is having the Public Hearing this evening. This ordinance is to have the Codebook updated on the "Sick and Disability Benefits". This will put the Township of Ocean in compliance with the State law.

There are several resolutions on the agenda this evening for purchases of equipment for different departments.

Resolutions 2021-204 and 2021-209 thru 2021-211. These resolutions are authorizing the purchase of items that the Township Committee has placed in the budget. This Township Committee has set in place a replacement program for each department. This year's purchases include a Police vehicle, Utility truck (replacing 2006 with 117,000 miles), John Deere loader and a street sweeper. These purchases will assist in allowing each department to work efficiently with a cost savings on repairs on the older equipment. All items are being purchased through State contract or a cooperative, which is an additional cost savings to the Township.

Resolutions 2021-200 thru 2021-203 and 2021-208. These resolutions are for grant money received to the Township to be placed and used in this year's budget. The grant funding is from Clean Communities, 966 Grant, Municipal Alliance, American Rescue Plan Act and a grant for Body Worn Cameras. The Township received a grant for the body worn cameras in the amount of \$48,912.00. The total cost is \$64,250.00. The additional funds came from the Police budget. Since this was an unbudgeted item that is necessary, the antenna item is now in the bond ordinance.

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The Ocean Township Committee has decided to cancel the Haunted Hayride in October.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed the Township sent out a request for skit volunteers. Not enough volunteers were received in time for the Township to present the Hayride in a professional manner. At this point, the Haunted Hayride will be cancelled this year. The Waretown Volunteer Fire Company might be looking to do a smaller event on that weekend. The Township has to see how the variant progresses.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

<u>Motion to open Public Comment</u> was moved by Mayor Dodd, seconded by Deputy Mayor LoParo. Roll Call: LoParo: Yes, Dodd: Yes.

John Petrosilli, Vessel Road, inquired if the bond is for Township improvements.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed the bulk of it is going towards the radios that need to be replaced in the Fire Department, First Aid Squad and Police Department. The radio ban currently being used will no longer be in service. The second part of the bond is for the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) grant, which the Township has to do every year. When the Township replaces a road, the drainage is also replaced. NJDOT does not pay for the drainage. The Township has to pay the money up front. NJDOT pays the Township and the Township pays down the bond with the money from NJDOT.

Mr. Petrosilli discussed the gazebo at the end of Bryant Road needs to be cleaned up. There are weeds and dead trees.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed that property is County property. The Township requested along with the Historical Society to use that portion for the gazebo.

Deputy Mayor LoParo inquired if the Township could clear the property and put stone there.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed she will send a request to Public Works.

Shawn Denning, 92 Morey Place Road, inquired if the Township is maintaining the capability to dispatch First Aid with the upgrade.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed the Township is not looking to change any of the service. The new radios allow the three departments to communicate with each other and Ocean County. The Police Dispatch will still dispatch First Aid.

Mr. Denning discussed the Board of Education would like the Township to help make the medical marijuana industry flourish here in town and inquired if the Township Committee thought about amending the ordinance for 2% tax to help offset the school's financial burdens.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed the Township is still waiting for the State rules to be issued before the Township Committee can make a decision. There is no tax associated with medical

marijuana come January 1st. Medical marijuana was set up for a five-year period with no tax after that time.

Mr. Denning inquired if the Township Committee is planning on moving quickly, when the rules are issued. Some towns have initiated sunsetting clauses.

Township Attorney Dasti discussed all municipalities had to either prohibit it or they could not do anything for five years. It is written in the statute that there is one chance to regulate it. If it is not done by August 22, 2021, then the municipality cannot do anything for five years. The ABC/Marijuana Commission is supposed to adopt its regulations. The Township Planner is reviewing the Township Zoning Map as to where it will be allowed. When the rules and regulations are issued, the Township Planner will review them, the Governing Body will review them and I will review them. Let's see if the State of New Jersey meets its deadline of the 21st.

Mr. Denning discussed when the Township looks at the rules, the Board of Education asks that a 2% tax go to the schools. That is the official position of the School Board. The school is facing a tremendous budget shortfall. Any dollars that come from this industry should help the school. It could help offset tax increases. The school is very eager to get this going.

Mayor Dodd discussed the government works slow, mainly the State. The Township Committee is not going to commit to anything tonight.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed the Township is waiting for specifics from the State.

Deputy Mayor LoParo discussed he is not going to sit on it and would like to move on it as soon as he can. There might be zoning changes that have to be made. That may take time.

Mayor Dodd discussed the Township's record speaks for itself. The Township does not sit on things.

Mr. Denning discussed the Ocean Township School Board is working with other schools to ban together regarding the Governor Murphy masking mandate. The school is going to be sending a letter opposing the statewide mask mandate. The Ocean Township School Board has had meetings with other districts in the County and there has been good showing. There is a rally tomorrow in Manahawkin to unmask our children.

Joseph Fabozzi, 99 Bay Parkway, discussed the title of Deputy Mayor. The Township website states that the Township Committee selects a Mayor for a one year term. The Township website states nothing about how a Deputy Mayor is selected or how it came into existence. The Executive Branch of the Federal Government consists of the President, Vice President and their cabinet. The Legislative Branch of the Federal Government consists of the House and the Senate. Mr. Fabozzi inquired why the Ocean Township Committee has two members of the Executive Branch of Local Government and one member of the Legislative Branch of Government. There should be only one Mayor and two Committeepersons in Waretown's local government.

Township Attorney Dasti discussed the three-member Township Committee is the Legislative Branch of Government. Each Township Committeeperson has one equal vote and elect the Chairperson and Vice Chairperson every year. The Mayor and Deputy Mayor have no more power than the Committee. They are all equal. The only thing the Mayor and Deputy Mayor can do by law is perform a marriage. The

Deputy Mayor sits in the chair of the Mayor, when the Mayor is not here. In other forms of government, when the Mayor is absent the Council President is the acting Mayor when the Mayor is out of town or unable to perform his or her Mayoral duties.

Mr. Fabozzi discussed 1% of recreational marijuana should be set aside for property tax rebates. The Township should do marijuana, gambling and prostitution and 1% of all that should go back to the tax payers. It was done with prostitution in Las Vegas. Masks should be your own decision.
