Public Hearing

- ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION:

- Baltic Avenue - possible drainage

Township Engineer, Jason Worth, discussed this is the second public hearing for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), which is a federally funded grant through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, administered through Ocean County Planning. The CDBG meeting is an opportunity to discuss potential projects, give an opportunity for the public to comment on those projects or make any recommendations themselves.

At the first public hearing the Township Committee discussed projects, including the Baltic Avenue area, as well as the firehouse doors. Township Engineer Worth discussed he looked at both areas and communicated to the Township Administrator that the roadway and drainage conditions on Baltic Avenue is a better area to focus on improvements, especially at the end of the street. The Township can look at other grants to work on the rest of the street. It certainly is in need and fits in with the program objectives for the grant.

Township Engineer Worth discussed the drain is 25 feet beyond the edge of the pavement. Water is not draining to it. The outfall is an old metal pipe. It's life expectancy cannot be much longer. In the past, the Township has looked to extend the pipes further so the sand does not get clogged and to create better flushing. The drain would be moved to the edge of the pavement.

Committeeman Baulderstone inquired if there is going to be enough slope to make this effective.

Township Engineer Worth discussed, yes. The Township would look to extend that pipe into the water a little bit further. As the shoreline goes down, there would be more slope on the pipe.

Committeeman Baulderstone inquired if the pipe is corrugated inside as well as outside.

Township Engineer Worth discussed it is corrugated inside and outside. The old metal pipes are just one wall. The new plastic pipes are corrugated outside but smooth on the inside, so they are dual-walled. That holds sediment and debris a lot more easily and will rust out with the salt water.

All roads North of the out basin, Oregon Avenue, Illinois Avenue and Ocean Avenue have already been completed. The neighborhood South would certainly be a Phase II and a good area to look for a New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) grant. There is one area that is just a concrete chute that heads down into the water. He has not quite seen that before.
